# ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

FROM DIFFERENT UNIVERSITIES







International Students are admitted to the Goshen College and study away from home. They have students coming from Brazil, India, China, Korea and England, to name some.

The college is accepting applicants from around the world. They take a holistic approach in their admissions decision. Students must submit proper documentation of their learning differences to the writing center of the college for accommodation.

- Signed Certificate of Financial Responsibility, and then pay the \$200 enrollment fee
- Letters of support
- Bank statements
- Visa
- Complete application through the common application,
   GC online application
- Fee for the application is waived for international students.
- Submission of transcripts to the World Education Services or INCRED International Credential Evaluations
- Submission of the TOEFL/IELTS examinations reports
- ACT/SAT scores can be submitted, not required.

#### **DEADLINES**

- June 1 submission of applications
- July 1- completed applications with supporting documents
- October 1 application submission
- November 1 completed application with supporting documents





Applications to the Middlebury College should be filed through the Common Application of the school or through the Coalition application. However, take note that the mid-year report forms and transcript request forms provided may not be all pertaining to international education systems.

In this case, candidates must ask their school administrators to submit or forward needed standardized tests, transcripts and recommendations to the admission office.

The ACT or SAT standardized tests results must be submitted. If the applicant isn't a native English speaker, they're required to submit test scores of proficiency exams. The school will consider TOEFL results.

In addition to that, they can also consider exam results from a number of other assessments, including IELTS, ACT, SAT, MELAB or CPE, and the "Pearson Test of English Academic. Finally, they will also accept predicted grades in IB English A courses. Applicants must also complete the interviews.

The school also has schools abroad including in Brazil, China, Chile, India, Japan and Spain and in more than 40 universities worldwide. It also has exchanges in East Anglia, Norwich as well as in the University of Nottingham. Affiliated programs are also available.



Popular majors in the schools include economics, sociology, political science and anthropology. International applicants are invited to work with the Piper Center for Vocation and Career for student and faculty internships and research projects.

Students may apply for the Early Decision, which application deadlines are either November 15 or January 8, or in the Regular Decision, which is on January 15.

- Students must have completed high school education or any national exams for university admission in native countries. You may also check out the complete requirements on their official site.
- Test scores, minimum for TOEFL, 90; IELTS, 6.5
- F-1, J-1 for international students
- SAT I/ACT must be taken no later than January; results must be mailed to St. Olaf.
- Transcripts, Marksheets or Gradesheets (Transcripts must in the language of instruction; should contain legible stamp or seal of the school)

In order to be eligible for the applications, students must comply with all these requirements. They must also submit the application documents on or before the deadline. The school's official page has a complete timeline of submissions.



The university makes lasting connections at their partner universities globally. They recognize that learning must extend beyond the classrooms at the U of A. Their students interview refugees in India or study economic or arts at their University of Arkansas Rome Center.

They accept students from Bolivia, Vietnam, Australia, and Zambia and everywhere in the world. They have more than 1,500 students coming from 112 countries.

International students will be picked and nominated by their affiliated universities from around the world.



- Scan of national ID or passport, if still processing passport
- Filled up application form through their online portal
- All documents should be electronically submitted; the original documents or the hard copy applications are not accepted.

In order to be eligible for the applications, students must comply with all these requirements. They must also submit the application documents on or before the deadline. The school's official page has a complete timeline of submissions.

Complete the online application. You can complete paying the application fee using a credit card. When your application is submitted successfully, you will receive the message, "Thank you for submitting an application for admission to the University of Arkansas." Send an email to iao@uark.edu to learn about your application's status.





The school accepts students from abroad; in fact, they have more than 2000 students from 107 countries. You must complete the application process on or before the deadline for consideration. Applicants may also apply through the Common Application.

All the application documents should be submitted at the same time. For supporting materials, they can be sent or mail by FedEx to the Office of Admissions.

Sometimes ACT English or SAT reading test scores may be used in meeting the EP or English proficiency.

The university programs draw exceptional students from all corners of the world and most backgrounds. To become a part of their international student community, one must complete the application and submit the documents on time. They may visit the Office of Undergraduate Admissions for the complete information, such as the financial aid available for international students.

For graduate applicants, they should check with their academic departments. International applicants may also read more from U Admissions. The Need-Blind policy applies to all applicants for the school.
